

These existing members of staff were then joined by the Visionary Advisory Committee that was chaired by Mr.


Kyaligonza Samuel Araali, who has worked closely with his 7 member committee to date.



ACADEMIC JOURNEY

A BRISTOL Primary School has won a top gardening for part of its work with a school in Uganda.

Bristol City Council awarded Hillcrest Primary School in Totterdown the best school plot prize for its pupils' series of mini allotments.

The school has converted a derelict piece of adjoining land to give each of the 14 classes their own allotment on which they can grow food.

The development was part of a link project with schools in Uganda – Growing Stronger, Growing Together. A special presentation ceremony was attended by two staffs of Kigumba Primary School in Uganda. The project was a community effort with several local organizations donating materials. Head teacher Norma Watson said “children and staffs worked together on the plots with the horticultural advice provided by another parent.

“children have loved the experience of producing and eating the food for school dinners as well as in the classroom. All of them agree the food they have grown taste delicious.

“Because we produce so much food, we sold some of our fruits and vegetables to parents at the end of the school day at the Totterdown town square market at weekends.

couldn't find their way home. What will we do now? Soon it will be dark.



HISTORY OF BURUNDI COUP

Burundi, a country of 10 million people, was founded a kingdom in 1500s, but has been characterized by coup and assassinations of its leaders since it declared independent.

In 1890 German East Africa Company incorporated the kingdoms of Urundi and Rwanda in their colonial exploitation plans. But Belgians occupied the area in 1916. On its path to in-

dependence, prince Louis Rwagasore won the legislative elections in 1961, but was assassinated shortly afterwards. In 1962, Urundi broke off from Rwanda, becoming an independent kingdom under King Mwambutsa IV. The following years, ethnic violence among Hutu and Tutsi forced thousands of Hutus to flee to Rwanda.

Army chief Michel Micombero attempted an unsuccessful coup against Mwambutsa. It was, however, the king's son Ntare who de-

posed him in July 1966. Micombero would return to court, and declared himself president. Micombero was also overthrown by Jean-Baptiste Bagaza in a military coup in 1972 and Buyoya spearheaded a new constitutional order providing for a multiparty system that was adopted in a referendum in 1992.




